

# Cassia Fistula: Golden shower & 'disease killer'

This tree has a long history of medicinal use, which dates back to ancient times and is still commonly used in modern medicine across the globe

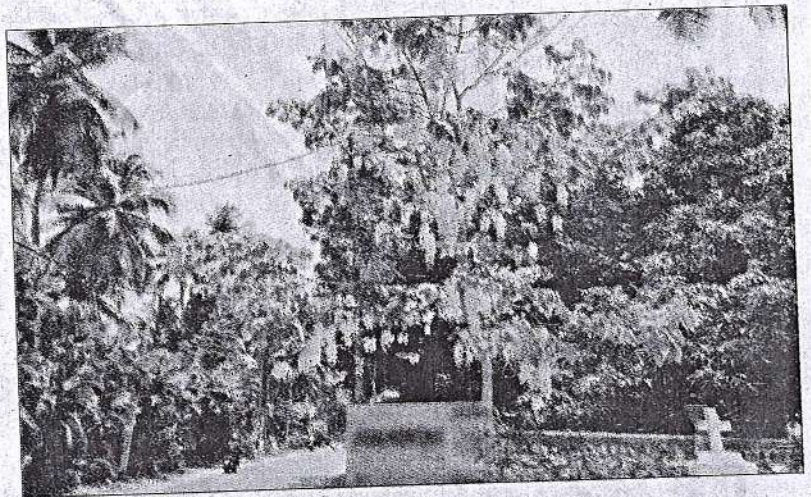

I am fascinated by this most beautiful tree, Cassia Fistula, which bears the cluster of pendent mass of long, bright yellow, grape-bunches of flowers with no leaves on the tree, when in full bloom, if you move along the roadsides or peep into some of the gardens in Goa you will find this beauty. Of course I have tried to grow this tree in our campus, to add to the scenic beauty.

'Cassia fistula' is a medium sized tree, belonging to family Fabaceae (legume family) of subclass Caesalpinaceae also known as the golden shower, Bhavo, Amaltaas or Indian laburnum. The botanical name 'Cassia,' comes from the Greek word 'Kassia' which means fragrant plant. And the name 'fistula' means shepherd's pipe, which refers to the shape of the fruit.

It is the national flower and the national tree of Thailand. This beautiful flower symbolised Thai Royalty. The blooms are commonly called 'dok koon' in the Thai language. Thailand has a 48-cent stamp of the flower, which commemorates the joint collaboration of Canadian and Thai Design. It is also the state flower of God's own country, Kerala.

This popular ornamental plant is native to India. A tropical medium sized tree, about 40 feet tall, the trunk is usually hard and reddish, the leaves are compound with large, lanceolate, dark green to light green leaflets. The showy pendant racemes grow up to 15 cm long with yellow bunches of fragrant flowers, which are much attracted by bees and



butterflies. The fruits are dark-brown cylindrical pods, about 15-20 cms long with flattish, brown seeds found in each cell inside the pod.

It is wonderful to know that nothing is useless in nature. God has made all things for different purposes, even the plants. Everything comes with a purpose and everything is useful.

This tree has a long history of medicinal use, which dates back to ancient times and is still commonly used in modern medicine and has been cultivated for the same.

Medicinally, it can be used as antifungal, antioxidant, antimicrobial, anti-inflammatory, anti-tumour, hepatoprotective and hypoglycemics. It has been particularly used in our state for treatment of Jaundice, Gout, Fatty liver, Liver disorders, Bronchitis, skin diseases etc. Therefore, considered as a "Disease Killer."

According to SK Jain, Director of Institute of Ethnobotany, NBRI, Lucknow (1968) and the former director of Botanical Survey of India, Calcutta, who worked extensively amongst certain aboriginal tribes of India, to study the plants used for food, medicine etc, states that medicinal properties have been attributed to nearly all parts of the tree.

The fruit is the most important and is included in the Indian Pharmaceutical Codex. The pulp from the fruits called 'Cassia pulp' is a well-known laxative. In large quantities, it causes purging, nausea and griping, it is not used singly, but in admixture with Senna leaves etc.

The bark and leaves are used for skin diseases, leaves can be also used as mild laxative, the paste if used as poultice for swelling, due to insect bites, rheumatism, swelling, facial paralysis, treatment of piles, ulcers and menstrual cramps. Flowers can be used for fever, while the roots are diuretic. Amaltaas fruits are used in treatment of diabetes and to reduce inflammation.

The plant is rich in tannins, flavonoids, glycosides, carbohydrates, linoleic, oleic and stearic acids. Cassia fistula blooms in April-May in hot weather. It takes about five years for the tree to flower under favourable condition.

The propagation is by seeds but the germination is poor. The tree grows well in dry tracts, therefore, can be suggested for social forestry, to grow along the road sides and rail tracts. It would be wise, if we grow it in our own compounds, which will not only add to the beauty, but help us in medicinal use.

## Temple and church burgled at Cortalim

**Vasco:** A temple and a church situated in the Cortalim constituency were burgled by robbers on Wednesday night.

According to the police, the thieves entered into the St Philip and James Church at Cortalim and Ganeshpuri temple at Sancoale and decamped with cash and other valuables, totally valued at Rs 55,000. The thieves broke the latch of the church office door and stole cash Rs 55,000 which was kept in the cupboard of the church office.

St Philip and James Church parish priest Fr Pio Almeida said that the thieves entered the office at around 2 am when he woke up to go to the washroom. He said that he heard some noise and immediately checked the CCTV footage which showed the thieves rummaging the office cupboard. Fr Almeida said that he immediately alerted another priest and they could not go out of the church premises as the thieves as bolted their door from outside.

Fr Almeida said that they immediately informed the Verna police, who arrived at the church premises but the thieves by then had escaped. When checked it was found that the thieves had rummaged the office and decamped with cash Rs 55,000 after breaking the cupboard.

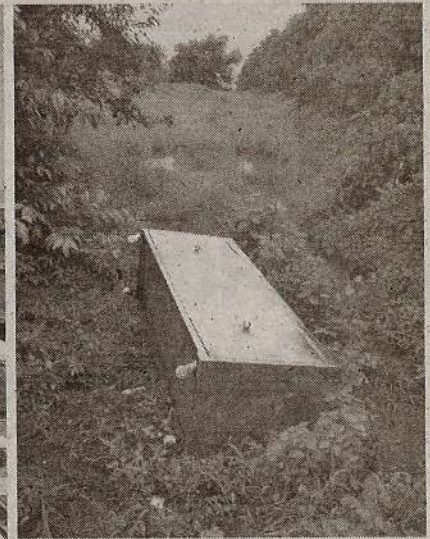
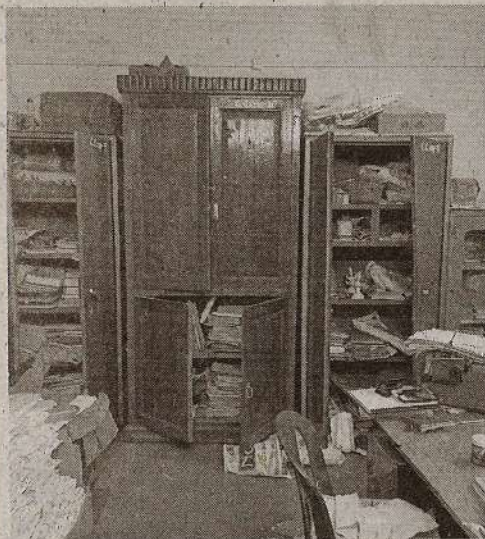
The Verna police have registered a case against unknown persons under sections 457 and 380 read with 34 IPC and PSI Prajit Mandrekar is conducting further investigations under the guidance of Verna PI Sandesh Chodankar.

In another incident, the thieves entered into the Ganeshpuri temple, situated at Sancoale and stole donation box containing cash of around Rs 5000. The empty donation box was later found thrown in the nearby bushes. The thieves entered in by breaking the grills of the window, police said.

The temple managing committee secretary Ulhas Naik has filed a police complaint in this regard.

Meanwhile, the villagers of Sancoale and Cortalim have demanded that the police should intensify night patrolling in the areas and keep a vigil on migrants, residing in the nearby areas.

According to reports, the burglars in masks and helmets and armed with weapons like choppers and koita entered the St Philip and James church at Cortalim by breaking open the door latches of church office and decamped with cash of Rs 50,000 from the safe of the Church office.

Speaking to reporters, Cortalim Parish Priest Fr Pio Almeida said the burglary was captured on CCTV camera.

"I woke up at about 2 am to go to the wash room, when I heard some noises and checked the CCTV footage from my room. I saw a few people roaming around in the office and they were captured by CCTV camera placed in our office."

"I immediately woke up another priest and alerted up. We could not go out because they had weapons and they

had latched the rooms from the outside."

"We notified the Verna police and they immediately arrived on the site. We noticed that the burglars had broke open the cupboard in the office and cash of Rs 50,000 placed in the safe was stolen," said Fr Almeida.

Verna police later registered an offence against three unknown culprits under Section 457, 380 read with 34 IPC and PSI Prajit Mandrekar of Verna police station is investigating the incident.

In another incident, burglars stole a donation box containing cash of about Rs 5,000 from the Ganesh Temple at Sancoale.

The temple committee members informed police that the burglars entered into the temple by breaking open the window grill and stealing the donation box.

The burglars later threw the empty donation box in the bushes around 100 metres from temple, said the temple committee secretary Ulhas Naik.

Temple committee members and locals in the area have demanded strict police patrolling in the area and to keep a check on migrants entering Goa, who could be involved in such crimes.

Former temple committee president Gaurish Naik said these burglaries could be the handiwork of migrants and insisted that police must keep a check on the influx of migrants in the State.

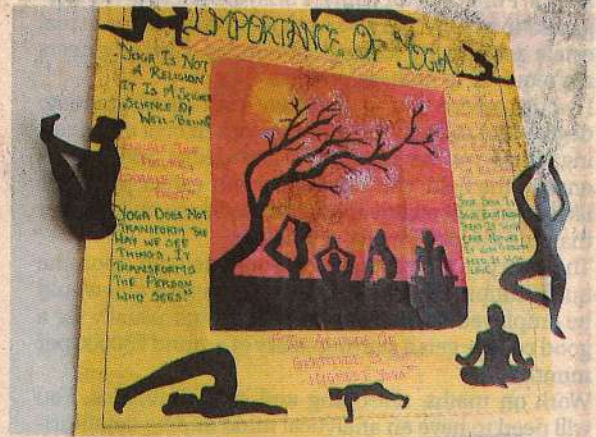

# Ascension: Jesus' glorification

**As Catholics all over the world celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of Jesus into heaven today, here is a look at what it is all about**

**FR WALTER DE SA**

**T**he faithful all over the world will rejoice and celebrate the feast of the Ascension of the Risen Lord. The resurrection of Jesus Christ (Easter) marks the beginning of the Paschal season, during which time two important and historical events are celebrated, namely, the Ascension of Jesus Christ into heaven, and the Pentecost. While Ascension is celebrated on the fortieth day after Easter, the Pentecost is celebrated on a Sunday following the Sunday of the Ascension of Our Lord.

Etymologically, Pentecost means the fiftieth day when the Holy Spirit, the promised one, descended on the apostles. In common parlance, the Pentecost is the feast of the Holy Spirit.

It is an old tradition for the parish of Panaji to celebrate the feast of the Ascension with great religious fervour. It is preceded by a preparatory novena of nine days during which people gather in the Church and participate in the Holy Eucharist and reflect on the Word of God in order

to deepen their faith and follow in the footsteps of Jesus Christ. This feast becomes an important means that brings people from the parish together, enabling them to grow in fellowship, brotherly affection, and solidarity, and thus, create a family within the parish.

Mark and Luke, in their gospels, document the fact of the ascension of Jesus. For instance, Mark (16:19) writes: "Then, after speaking to them, the Lord Jesus was taken up into heaven and took his seat at God's right hand". In the gospel of Luke, towards the end of the last chapter (24:51), he puts on record the following: "As he (the Risen Jesus) blessed, he left them, and was taken up to heaven". Also, in the Acts of the Apostles, Luke connects with his gospel where he had written down: "all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up to heaven" (1: 1-2), and further on, he mentions the appearances of the Risen Lord "over the course of forty days" (1:3), thereby, implying that Jesus' ascension took place after forty days. Luke also reiterates that "No sooner had he (the Risen Lord) said this than he was lifted up before their



eyes in a cloud which took him from their sight" (1:9)

The ascension means the exaltation of Jesus who was glorified by God the Father on account of his triumph and victory over sin and death. Prior to his ascension, Jesus imparted blessing to his disciples, and commissioned them with a mission to go to the whole world and to proclaim the good news. He also disclosed that he was leaving them in order to prepare a place for them, and then, he would return to take them so that "where I am you may be also" (Jn 14:3)

On the mount of Olives, in Jerusalem, from where Jesus was lifted up, there stands a small Church of the Ascension, round in architecture, wherein one can still see a stone with the footprints of Jesus. This Church attracts a large crowd of pilgrims and tourists.

May the feast of Ascension nurture in us an ardent desire to experience and accomplish the blessing of being with him so that where he, the head, has gone, we too, the body, may hopefully reach one day.

This feast becomes an important means that brings people from the parish together, enabling them to grow in fellowship, brotherly affection and solidarity, and thus, create a family within the parish.

Mark and Luke, in their Gospels, document the fact of the ascension of Jesus. For instance, Mark (16:19) writes: "Then, after speaking to them, the Lord Jesus was taken up into heaven and took his seat at God's right hand". In the gospel of Luke, towards the end of the last chapter (24:51), he puts on record the following: "As he (the Risen Jesus) blessed, he left them, and was taken up to heaven". Also in the Acts of the Apostles, Luke connects with his gospel where he had written down "all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up to heaven" (1: 1-2), and further on, he mentions the appearances of the Risen Lord "over the course of forty days" (1:3), thereby, implying that Jesus' ascension took place after forty days. Luke also reiterates that "No sooner had he (the Risen Lord) said this than he was lifted up before their eyes in a cloud which took him from their sight" (1:9).

The ascension means the exaltation of Jesus who was glorified by God the Father on account of his triumph and victory over sin and death. Prior to his ascension, Jesus imparted blessing to his disciples, and commissioned them with a mission to go to the whole world and to proclaim the good news. He also disclosed that he was leaving them in order to prepare a place for them and, then, he would return to take them so that "where I am you may be also" (Jn 14: 3).

On the mount of Olives, in Jerusalem, from where Jesus was lifted up, there stands a small Church of the Ascension, round in architecture, wherein one can still see a stone with the footprints of Jesus. This Church attracts a large crowd of pilgrims and tourists.

May the feast of Ascension nurture in us an ardent desire to experience and accomplish the blessing of being with him so that where he, the head, has gone, we too, the body, may hopefully reach one day.
